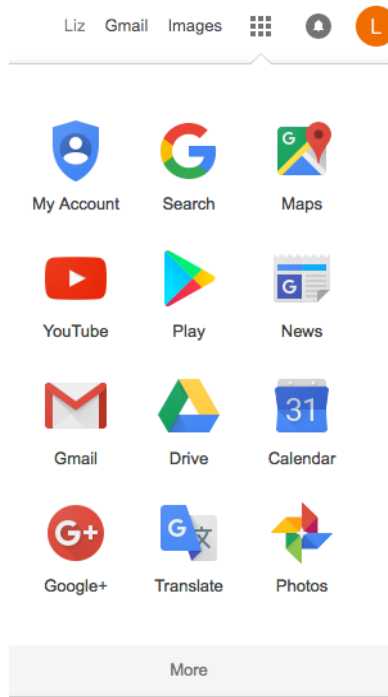


Searching with Google: An illustrated guide

Google is a powerful search engine. Many researchers are using the tool to find secondary data and content. The illustrated guide is a simple navigational tool intended to help with the research process. Follow the steps below for an entry-level experience.

Find the menu of options. Look to the upper right of the Google home page to find a set of nine dots in a square formation. Click on the dots to find the menu pictured below. Click on “more” at the bottom of the menu to find additional options. Click “Even more from Google” at the additional option page to find Google scholar and other attractive options.



Most SAS faculty and students know Google scholar as a strategy for finding research articles. If you have not experimented with Google Scholar, consider trying the option now. Google scholar will use simple descriptions or single words to find articles. Use the advanced search function (described further in the guide) for precision.

Advanced search. Another path to exploring with Google is to go directly to advanced search. Advanced search will allow the user to stipulate topics, dates, and other specifics.

Type advanced search in the Google search window.

A list of search options will come up immediately. See screen shot above for examples. You can develop a powerful, targeted exploratory search using Google advanced search. And, you can search almost any topic (Blogs, Twitter, movies, videos, music, and so on).

Setting up a Google alert. As you continue to follow your research interest, Google can monitor the Internet for you. Setting up a Google Alert will allow you to receive news of recent publications or other items of interest. Google can explain the process if you type “setting up a Google Alert” in the tool bar.
